Tucson, Arizona GOVERNING BOARD POLICY

POLICY TITLE: Exceptional Education Programs

POLICY CODE: IHB LEAD DEPARTMENT: Exceptional Education

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SPECIAL_INSTRUCTIONAL_PROGRAMS

A long-range plan will be the basis for providing special education services for students _with exceptional needs and education requirements._ These services may include _specialized programs, personnel, facilities, materials, and equipment needed to promote_the individual physical, social, intellectual, and emotional growth of exceptional _students._

The Superintendent shall developensure that procedures that provide educational opportunities for

_individuals with disabilities and thatshall accomplish District compliance with federal laws _including the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), the Arizona revised _statutes, and the lawful regulations of the State Board of Education._ Such procedures _shall include, but not be limited to, the following provisions:

<u>AllA. The District will ensure that all</u> children with disabilities <u>aged</u>, <u>between the age</u> of birth (0) through twenty-one (21) years, within the <u>District's jurisdiction are to be</u> identified, located, and evaluated <u>boundaries of the District</u>, including children with disabilities who are homeless or wards of the state, and children with <u>disabilities</u> attending <u>religious or</u> private schools <u>or home schools</u>, regardless of the <u>severity of their disability</u>, and who are in need of special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated.

-<u>B.</u> A free appropriate public education (FAPE) shall be available to all children with disabilities aged three (3)-through twenty-one (21) years within the <u>District's</u> <u>District's</u> jurisdiction, including children advancing from grade to-_grade, those who have been suspended or expelled from school in accordance with the applicable IDEA rules and regulations, and any child with a disability the District has placed in or referred to a private school-or facility. The District may refer to and contract with approved public or private agencies as necessary to ensure the provision of FAPE for children with disabilities. FAPE for an eligible student with a disability shall extend through conclusion of the instructional year during which the student attains the age of twenty-two (22).

-C._A full and individual initial evaluation encompassing existing and additional data shall be will be conducted for each child to determine if the child is a child with a disability and the educational needs of the childby the public education agency before the initial provision of special education _and related services. to a child with a disability in accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.300–300.311 of the IDEA regulations. A reevaluation of each child shall<u>with a disability will</u> be conducted at least<u>by the public education agency in accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.300–300.311 of the IDEA regulations.</u> every third year.

 AnD. Procedures for child identification and referral shall meet the requirements of the IDEA and its regulations, A.R.S. Title 15, chapter 7, and its regulations, and the State Board of Education rules R7-2-401.

E. The District shall ensure that an individualized education planprogram (IEP) shall beis developed and implemented for _each eligible child served by the District and for each eligible child the District _places in or refersreferred to a private school or facilityby the District in accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.320 – 300.325 of the IDEA regulations. An IEP or an individualized _family service plan (IFSP) will be in place for each child with a disability prior to _the provision of FAPE._

•-F. To the maximum extent appropriate, opportunities for the least restrictive setting, environment, inclusion in educational exercises with regular program students, and for interaction with the total school environment will be provided to exceptional students, the exception to be only when the student'sstudent's condition, with supplementary aids and services, make such regular class education unsatisfactory-in accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.114 – 300.117 of the IDEA regulations.

<u>All requiredG. The District shall establish, maintain, and implement procedural safeguards must be guaranteed to the exceptional students and their parents. The parents that meet the requirements of 34 C.F.R. 300.300 – 300.311 of the IDEA regulations. Parents will be provided with notices of _procedural safeguards in each specified instance and all due process conditions _will be satisfied with respect to the provision of a free appropriate public education.</u>

<u>H.</u> The District shall follow will ensure that protection of the established state and federal standards to protect the confidentiality of personallyany personal identifiable data, information at the collection, storage, and records collected or maintained by the District will be in accordance with 34 C.F.R. 300.611-300.627. disclosure, and destruction stages.

•I. To the extent essential to provide FAPE to children with disabilities aged three (3) through twenty-one (21), extended school year (ESY) services shall be made available and implemented as necessary.

•_J._Criteria for the graduation of exceptional students, including accomplishment in _reading, writing, and mathematics, shall be as specified in the District policy on _graduation requirements._ Such standards shall be equivalent to or greater than _those established by the State Board of Education.

• NoK. Not later than March 1 of each year conduct a review of the reasonable and

acceptable ratio of students per teacher for each disability category. The _applicable ratios shall be specified in a regulation accompanying the District _policy on class size.

-L. The discipline of exceptional students, and unevaluated students suspected of having a qualifying disability, is to be conducted in such a manner as to comply with FAPE and requirements of the IDEA.

A child with a disability may be disciplined for a violation of the student code of conduct, including removal from his or her current placement to an appropriate interim alternative education setting, another setting, suspension, or expulsion in accordance with IDEA Regulations 34 C.F.R. 300.530 through 300.536.

For the purpose of this policy as it relates to a child with a disability, *home school district* means the school district in which the person resides who has legal custody of the child as provided in A.R.S. 15-824. If the child is a ward of the state and a specific person does not have legal custody of the child or is a ward of this state and the child is enrolled in an accommodation school pursuant to A.R.S. 15-913, the home school district is the district the child last attended or, if the child has not previously attended a public school in this state, the school district within which the child currently resides.

The Superintendent is authorized and directed to establish procedures for the _development and administration of the necessary programs, and to document District _compliance with the law and this policy._ Such procedures will be made available to staff _members and to parents as necessary to enhance compliance.
