<u>G. Teachers should place major emphasis upon "why" and "how" to</u> <u>think rather than "what" to think.</u>

Teaching critical thinking and communication skills utilizing controversial or sensitive subjects such as those involving political or religious points of view must be done in an objective and impartial manner. Students shall be instructed in:

- Issue analysis
- Formulation of opinions
- Communication of opinions
- Respectful disagreement

Such discussions shall always be aligned with the curriculum and age appropriate.

	Furthermore, state law and Board Policy KB - Parental Involvement in Education require advance parental notice and the ability to opt out of any instructional activity parents may deem "harmful" to their child. At the same time, teacher academic freedom is protected under Policy IB – Academic Freedom.
