 - 3 year cycle, 2014–2017
 - \$737,720.00 per year
 - 8 School Resource Officers
 - 1 Supervisor
 - Started January 2015 and deployed at:
 - Booth Fickett K– 8 School
 - Catalina High School
 - Cholla High School
 - Palo Verde High School
 - Santa Rita High School
 - Tucson High School
 - Utterback Middle School

- We are halfway through the grant this month
- The process to reapply will start this summer

Overview - PCSD SRO's

- 3 School Safety Officers at no cost to TUSD
 - Officers are shared with the following school districts:
 - Alter Valley School District
 - Sunnyside School District
 - Tanque Verde School District
 - Started October 2015 and deployed at:
 - Sabino High School
 - Valencia Middle School
 - Pistor Middle School

What has been accomplished?

- Basic and continuing training at ADE
- 1665 hours of law related education
- On campus rate of 89.0%
- SSP + Grant secured for Cholla High Magnet
- Bully Patrol model established at Booth-Fickett
- Cholla after school program for students interested in criminal justice careers
- All SRO's participate in School Climate/Safety meetings with staff

More accomplishments

- Regular participation in student mentoring and mediations (210 hours)
- Participation as requested in parent/teacher conferences
- Sponsoring of a student athlete
- Work with I-Heart Radio/Clear Channel Communications to arrange field trip for students interested in media careers.
- Invited special police and community units for demos, (Canine, SWAT, US Air Force)

Projects in Development

- A set course of instruction for primary grades in coping skills, relationships and solving problems without resorting to any type of mental or physical abuse of others.
- A course of instruction for students that are involved with narcotic offenses, to discuss the larger issues that may be occurring and learn about community treatment options.

Some courses received at the TPD Police Academy

- Racial Biased Based Policing: a 10 hour class that covered the unconscious biases that humans inherently possess and how to restrain from allowing it to effect decisions
- As part of the 16 week basic training academy, recruits receive the following specialized training directly related to dealing with situations that arise frequently in our schools
 - Stress Management 6 Hours
 - Mental Illness 2 Hours
 - Juvenile Law and Procedures 4 Hours
 - Cultural Awareness 12 Hours
 - Search and Seizure 18 Hours
 - Human Communication 12 Hours
 - Constitutional Law 6 Hours
 - Defensive Tactics 32 Hours
 - Use of Force 4 Hours

Training the SRO's have received since the program started

- GSRR and Pima County Guidelines on when TUSD would notify law enforcement versus handling situations administratively with school consequences
- SAIL and Restorative Practices
- School Safety Program New Officer Training provided by the Arizona Department of Education (in-depth 4 day training)
 - role of each partner (officers, administrators and supervising agencies)
 - community oriented/school based policing principles
 - child and adolescent development
 - the education system
 - school safety laws
 - use of data for decision making

Basic Training at ADE continued

- School culture and integrating with school staff
- Child Abuse First Responder training
- Joint Investigations with Department of Child Safety/Child Welfare Investigations
- School Discipline matrices/Disproportionate Minority Contact concerns
- School Violence/Threat Assessment Instrument
- Philosophical approach, program priorities (* school discipline matters belong to the schools)

Advanced SRO Training

- Connecting the Pieces with the School Safety Program: Tucson New Officer Technical Assistance –
 - Understanding the Educational System
 - Understanding a Child's Perspective
 - Law Related Education
 - >One day additional training per officer at ADE.
 - Law Related Education training of their choice
 - ➤ADE Tucson Seminar coming up on 2-9-16.

School Administrator Training

- One Day at ADE Normally attended with SRO
- Must be attended by the Site Principal and one Designee
- The training covers:
- > The role of ADE, the District, School, and SRO
- > The philosophy of the program
- LRE Requirements
- Required documentation

Cholla Magnet HS - SSP+ Grant

- 3 year grant to manage the impact that the SRO's have on school safety.
- ADE is partnering with UA Research and Intervention Team (Dr. Kris Bosworth)
- 47 schools participating, only 8 are in the group receiving enhanced intervention training.
- The school will receive \$10,000 over the three years for the collection of data. (student school climate surveys)
- District received \$8000.00 towards salaried time of School Social Worker
