


Since the 2016-2017 SY enrollment has TRIPLED IN CRC COURSES FROM 1,237 TO 4,136 STUDENTS this 2018-2019 SY.

African American students at 2.5%

has remained lower than Pima County (4.9), the state (4.0), and the national average (6.5)

Hispanic students at 2.0%

has remained lower than Pima County (4.9), the state (4.1), and the national average (9.2)

THE DISTRICT'S GRADUATION RATE over the last two years

African American student's rate is higher at 82% than Pima County (74), the state of Arizona (74), and the national average (80).

Hispanic student's rate is higher at 80%

than Pima County (71), the state of Arizona (72), and the national average (78).
