TUSD's Title 1 schools encourage parents to be part of the school planning process.  5, 6, 7, 8 Information is gathered from the monthly Native American Education Advisory Committee (NAEAC) meeting and articulation meetings held between the Pascua Yaqui Tri Yaqui Education Services program, members of council, school administrators, district administrators and NASS staff The members of the NAEAC committee also meet with Dr. Sanchez and Assistant Superintendents (Elementary, Secondary and Student Services) on a monthly basis. Notices of NAEAC meetings and public hearings are disseminated through US mail (student addresses are updated on a monthly basis). These notices are also posted at the schools, tribal education offices and at the district administration office. KPYT, the radio station of the Pascua Yaqui Tribe announces meeting dates and events.
4.	Disseminate applications, evaluations, program plans and other information related to the educational programs of the LEA in a timely manner. Allow the tribes and parents of Indian children an opportunity to review the materials, provide input on the needs of the Indian children, and recommend ways the school district can help Indian children benefit from the LEA's educational programs and activities.
