Welcome to the Healthcare Foundations program and your first step into the wonderful world of healthcare!

Course Objective

This course is designed to introduce students to the home health aide profession and prepare you for the required exams.

Over the duration of this course, we will explore the role of the home health aide, how the body works, learn about medical terminology, and how to care for people with medical conditions and disabilities. They will learn in the traditional classroom as well as hands-on lab situations.

Course Description

This course covers a broad range of topics, including, examining physical and emotional needs of patients. Students will learn about abuse and neglect and the direct legal and ethical ramifications. They will learn proper documentation skills as well as learning how to relay this through appropriate communication and cultural competency. Also, topics such as recognizing depression, dealing with Dementia and Alzheimer's, infection control, and emergency procedures. They will acquire skills in nutrition needs and food handling techniques, as well as using proper body mechanics when lifting and transferring patients. You will learn to assist individuals with grief and the end-of-life process.

Attendance
