Strategic Priority 1: Reflective Curriculum

TUSD will have classroom curricula, instruction and professional development that integrate diversity and high expectations for all students.

Year 2 Goal: Establish and maintain ELA and Social Studies Courses for K-8.

ELA Unit Overview 4th Grade, 4th Quarter, 3-5 weeks Migration/Immigration in United States

Unit Overview: Making a Home in a New Place

Unifying Concept:

Journeys and Explorations in United States

Overview:

Students will learn the history and importance of migration within the United States. Students will evaluate how and why people made journeys; learn how people overcame certain obstacles through migration, and building a community with multiple perspectives. Students will discover authors' motives while reading literature and informational texts, and interpreting their characters. Students will apply this learning to their own practices as readers and writers.

Purpose:

The AZCCRS require students to read, write and communicate using grade level texts. This unit provides opportunities for students to interact with complex, paired informational texts and practice narrative and persuasive writing in a variety of ways (whole class, small groups, and independently) focusing on essays and summarizing.

- Modified from an afterschool program to a push in model throughout the day

Enrollment in TUSD Pre-AP Honors Classes by Ethnicity and Year




Strategic Priority 5: Community Engagement
