HISTORY

- Cornerstone laid on October 25, 1907
- Opened as Tucson High School
- Roskruge joined the high school in 1914
- School named for George J. Roskruge, an English-born pioneer Tucsonan
- The two schools coexisted until 1923
- Phase out of grades 7 and 8 completed in 1972
- Bilingual magnet middle school joined neighborhood elementary in 1987
- Absorbed Richey School students in 2010
- Became K-8 Magnet in 2013
