What is E-Rate



E-Rate (Education Rate) is a federal program that provides discounts to help ensure that all eligible schools and libraries have affordable access to 21st century telecommunications and information services.

What services are eligible for E-rate?

Under the 2014 E-Rate Modernization Order, two categories of service are eligible for E-rate funding:

- Category 1: Services that enable Broadband connectivity <u>to</u> the school.
 Examples include Internet access, network service, and voice services*.
- Category 2: Services and equipment that enable Broadband connectivity <u>within</u> the school. Examples include cabling, switches, and wireless access points.



E-Rate does <u>not</u> provide discounts for end-user devices, such as computers.

*As of FY15-16, voice services are being phased out.

How much is the discount?

- The amount of the discount ranges from 20% to 90% of the costs of eligible services.
- Discount rates are determined by the percentage of students eligible for free and reduced lunches through the National School Lunch Program.

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• For most services, TUSD receives a district-wide discount of 80%.

How has TUSD benefited from E-Rate?

Since the program's inception, TUSD has received approximately **\$22.3M** in discounts on telecommunications services and equipment.

What is the Board being asked to approve?

In order to receive E-rate discounts each year, TUSD must submit an application to the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) and certify that the District has committed the funding required to pay the <u>non-discounted</u> portion of the items included on the application.





What is the Board being asked to approve?

The total amount that the Board is being asked to commit the District to is \$465K for FY16-17 district-wide Internet access, Wide-Area Network (WAN) service and voice services as well as Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) upgrades at approximately fifty schools:

Status of TUSD E-Rate Audit

- KPMG was engaged by USAC's Internal Audit Division in September 2015 to conduct a performance audit of TUSD's E-rate participation in FY14-15.
- The audit was completed in February 2016 and a draft report has been submitted by KPMG to USAC.
- The district will not see the report until it is finalized, however, the audit did not result in any findings.

Status of TUSD E-Rate Consultant

TUSD continues to contract with The Miller Institute for E-Rate consulting, however, their role has shifted to a quality control:
