

Eureka Math Tops in U.S. for Usage and Quality

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Of the most popular mathematics curricula for grades K-12, *Eureka Math*, created by the non-profit Great Minds, ranks #1 for both usage and quality.

A nationwide survey by the RAND Corporation found that 57% of elementary school and 47% of secondary teachers use *Eureka Math* or the version of this curriculum developed for EngageNY.org. This surpasses the use of any other curricula, particularly at the elementary level where the next most popular curriculum is used by just 32% of teachers.

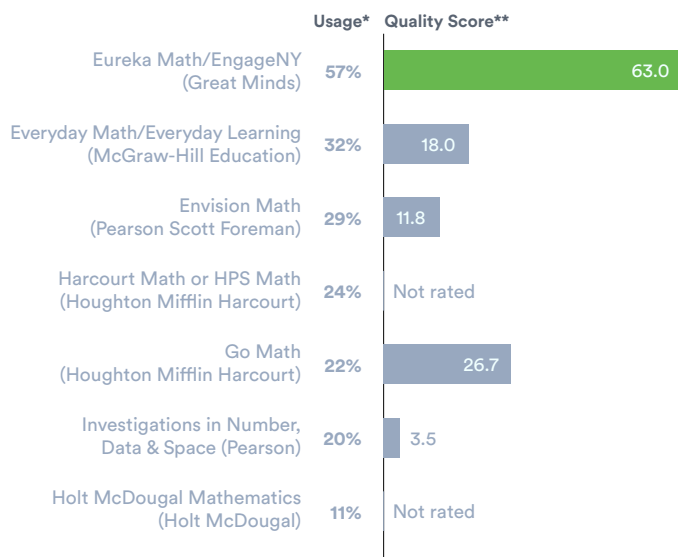
Separately, EdReports.org, the independent nonprofit that has been vetting K–12 curricula since March 2015, gave *Eureka Math* top marks for its focus/coherence, rigor, and usability.

Out of 70 possible points per grade from EdReports.org, *Eureka Math's* curricula for elementary grades averages 63.0 points, while the next most-used curriculum, Everyday Math, averages just 36.0.

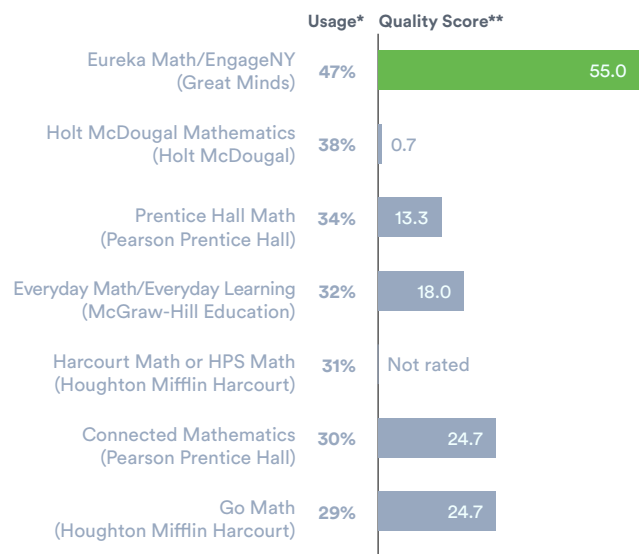
In middle school, the quality differences are even greater. *Eureka Math* scores 55.0 points on average, while Holt McDougal Mathematics scores less than 1.0.

The charts below show curricula ranked by popularity based on the RAND Corporation study findings with their corresponding EdReports.org score.

Its *Consumer Reports*-style reviews help teachers, principals, and district and state officials charged with purchasing materials make more informed choices.
