


### Curriculum Audit Time Line

- [26Jan-1Feb2014] Audit Team Site Visit
- [29April2014] Public report to TUSD School Board
- [1May2014] Report to Leadership Team including principals and key personnel
- [15July2014] Superintendent's Audit action plan merged with Strategic Plan to School Board
- [3-7 Years\*] Staff implementation \*(Mean = 5 years).

#### **Usual Procedures for a Curriculum Audit:**

- 1. The district's school board <u>accepts</u> but does not <u>approve</u> the audit with the public report.
- 2. Following the report, the school board requests a plan of action for responding to the audit recommendations from the superintendent.
- 3. The superintendent, with assistance from the administrative staff, submits a suggested plan of action on the audit to the school board.
- 4. The school board deliberates and adopts a plan to deal with the audit recommendations.

## Audit Standards

<u>CONTROL</u>- A school system is able to demonstrate its control of resources, programs, and personnel.

<u>DIRECTION</u>- A school system has established clear and valid objectives for students.

<u>CONNECTIVITY & EQUITY</u>- A school system demonstrates internal connectivity and rational equity in its program development and implementation.

<u>FEEDBACK-</u>A school system uses the results from system-designed and/or adopted assessments to adjust, improve, or terminate ineffective practices or programs.

<u>PRODUCTIVITY</u>- A school system has improved productivity.
