Unauthorized Access and Disclosure

- Prevent unauthorized access and other unlawful online activity;
- Prevent unauthorized online disclosure, use, or dissemination of personal identification information of minors; and
- Comply with the Children's Internet Protection Act [P.L. No. 106-554 and 47USC 245(h)]
- **EIS User Agreement** Each user will be required to sign an EIS user's agreement. The District may log the use of all systems and monitor all system utilization. Accounts may be closed and files may be deleted at any time. The District is not responsible for any service interruptions, changes, or consequences. The District reserves the right to establish rules and regulations as necessary for the efficient operation of the Electronic Information Services.
- Disclaimer The District does not assume liability for information retrieved via EIS. While the District will take reasonable steps to retrieve lost data, it does not, nor does it assume any liability for any information lost, damaged, or unavailable due to technical or other difficulties.
