Our last recognition is a talented group of students from Tucson High Magnet School who traveled to Philadelphia recently for the National Engineering Design Competition.

Advisor **Shelia Marquez** chaperoned her 11th Mathematics, Engineering, and Science Achievement (MESA) group of students to the National competition in June.

The competition consisted of building a prosthetic arm for less than eighty dollars and using arduino coding to open and close the fingers and to not actuate the motor with the other arm. Then, students used the arm complete three tasks: dexterity, distance accuracy, and object relocation. Lastly, students had to write a 15 page technical paper, design and create an academic display, and give an oral presentation.

Students placed in the following categories:

First Place in Dexterity, which is putting bolts in holes on a board then picking up a nut and screwing it on.

Third Place in Distance Accuracy, which is grabbing bean bags and tossing them at a target.

First Place on the Technical Paper

Second Place in Academic Display

Third Place in Design Efficiency, which takes into account the weight and cost of device.

Overall, the team placed Third.
