Team Teaching in Dual Language 6th - 12th

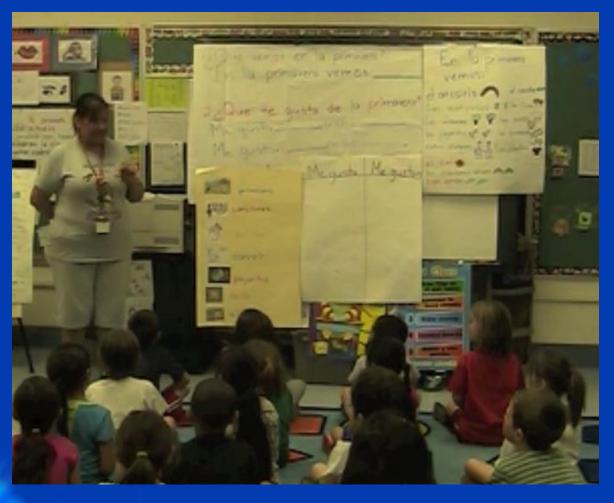
One teacher for each content area uses English as the language of instruction and the other teacher uses Spanish as the language of instruction. Students alternate between the Spanish and the English language content teachers by unit (not to exceed two weeks is duration).

*Team Teaching Model requires the following qualifications:

- ✓ A team of two teachers per content area.
 - Bilingual endorsed teacher provides content in Spanish language.
 - ESL or SEI endorsed teacher provides content in English language.
- Highly Qualified in subject area

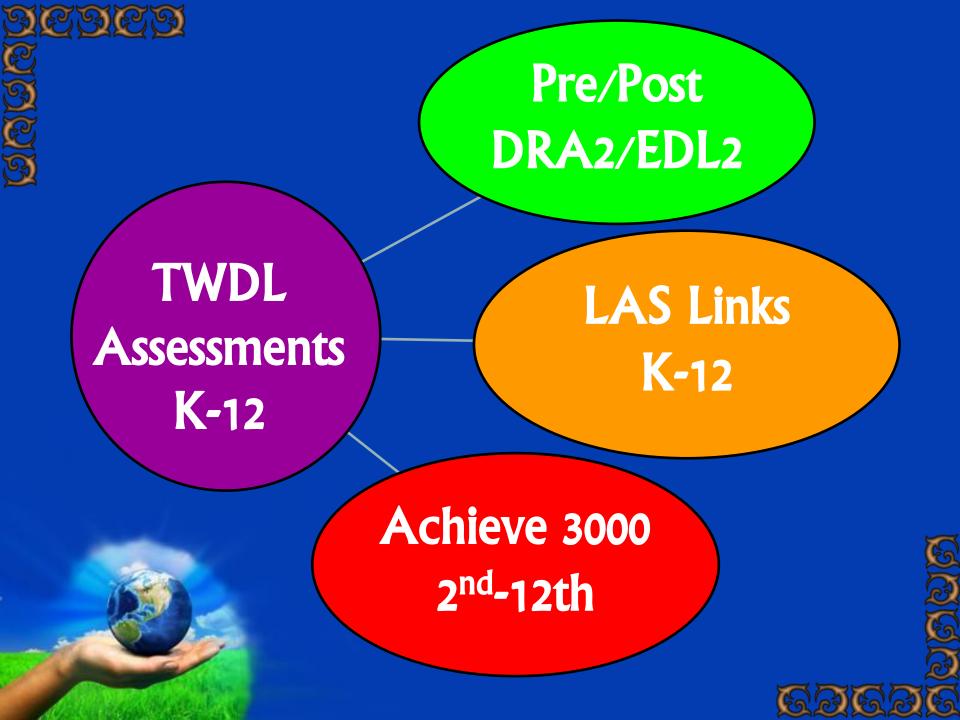
SMART GOALS

LAD Department will help all Dual Language Schools create SMART Goals that address the goals and expectations of the Dual Language program in their school wide plans.

Achieve 3000 Goal for TWDL Sites

 Goal 1: Build reading strength and stamina through close reading of rigorous informational text and targeted scaffolding in both English and Spanish.

Utilizing the Achieve3000 program, every student will complete 40 sessions by the end of the 1st semester and a total of 80 sessions by the end of the 2nd semester, to gain a 2.5x growth on their initial lexiles.

Goal: Fortify the Program

 LAD will provide staff development throughout the year that addresses the implementation of the model to personnel at all district levels. LAD will also continue to collaborate with HR to establish a recruitment program with incentives for bilingual endorsed elementary, secondary and exceptional education teachers.



- Recruit and strategically place the most qualified and proficient bilingually endorsed teachers.
- Develop incentive(s) for participating dual language teachers.
- Recruit and place eligible students for designated dual language classrooms.



Goal: Monitor TWDL Schools

• LAD will conduct walkthroughs using the Two-Way Dual Language Monitoring Form to observe instruction and the use of sheltered instructional strategies (SIOP Model) at participating TWDL sites. This will be done on quarterly basis.





Monitor and Adjust



- Monitor and evaluate teacher implementation of the approved TUSD TWDL Model.
- Monitor and evaluate teacher instruction in the use of sheltered instructional strategies (SIOP Model) to provide comprehensible input for all participating students.
- Monitor the implementation of Imagine Learning Español (K-2).

Goal: Data Rich

• LAD will provide technical assistance to the schools and the administration in the implementation of the district's Two-Way Dual Language instructional program and assessments. School sites will conduct Pre-Post assessments using DRA2/EDL2 and LAS Links K-12; Achieve3000 will be used on a weekly basis for grades 2-12, in addition, district benchmarks and state assessments will also be used.
