

Background on the UA CSGP

- 2010: started with 1 intern doing an independent study to support the Food Bank's CPPW initiatives
- 2011: became a formal service-learning course cross-listed with 7 units on UA campus
- enrolls undergraduates and graduate students who are placed to support the needs of their particular placement sites

UA Context of 100% Student Engagement

- UA President Hart's directive to have 100% student engagement by 2020
- UA's commitment to be a minority serving institution
- Legislature's mandate for the state's universities to serve all of Arizona's young people
- UA's efforts to increase the number of first generation (First-Gen) college students and provide a network to support their graduation



UA CSGP Today

has now trained and placed more than 500 interns in TUSD schools over the last 4 years

supports 14 TUSD schools including Borton, Davis, Doolen, Drachman, J.B. Wright, Manzo, Miles, Mission View, Ochoa, Roskruge, San Xavier Mission, Wildcat and Tucson High

 has invested over 6,000 hours in supporting TUSD school gardens
