OVERVIEW

- TUSD SPENDS NEARLY \$6 MILLION (2% OF M&O) ON SUBSTITUTE TEACHER SERVICES EACH YEAR (DOES NOT INCLUDE EXED TA'S)
- ABOUT 2/3 OF SUBSTITUTES ARE SHORT-TERM REASON: TEACHER ABSENCES
- ABOUT 1/3 OF SUBSTITUTES ARE LONG-TERM REASON: TEACHER VACANCIES OR LONG-TERM LEAVE
- SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS ARE CURRENTLY CONTRACTORS (ESI) TO TUSD AND CAN CHOOSE WHICH SCHOOLS THEY WANT TO WORK IN

• ON AVERAGE, SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS ARE PAID ABOUT \$100.00 A DAY



PURPOSE OF EVALUATION

TO CHARACTERIZE FOR THE FIRST TIME:

- THE DISTRIBUTION OF SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS ACROSS THE DISTRICT FOR SHORT-TERM AND FOR LONG-TERM POSITIONS
- THE FILL RATE OF SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS VIS-À-VIS THE NEED
- THE TYPE OF PERSON WHO CHOOSES TO BECOME A SUBSTITUTE TEACHER.
- REASONS FOR TEACHER ABSENCES

PERCENT OF SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM SUBS



- SHORT-TERM SUBS = 64%
- LONG-TERM SUBS = 36%

 SHORT-TERM SUBS NEEDED MOST AT HIGH SCHOOLS AND ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

• LONG-TERM SUBS NEEDED MOST AT ALTERNATIVE, K-8 AND MIDDLE SCHOOLS

SCHOOL PROFILES AND SUB NEEDS – NEED IS BASED ON PERCENT OF STUDENT ENROLLMENT


• SCHOOL RACIAL CONCENTRATION TYPE (CONCENTRATED, INTEGRATED, AND NEUTRAL): SUB NEEDS ARE BASED MORE ON STUDENT ENROLLMENT RATHER THAN THE RACIAL CONCENTRATION

 DUAL LANGUAGE SCHOOLS: SUB NEED IS EQUIVALENT TO REST OF DISTRICT EVEN WITH THE SPANISH LANGUAGE PREFERENCE


MAGNET SCHOOLS: SUB NEED IS SLIGHTLY HIGHER THAN THE REST OF THE DISTRICT

• A-F LETTER GRADE SCHOOLS: HIGHER PERFORMING SCHOOLS NEEDED FEWER SUBS AND LOWER PERFORMING SCHOOLS NEEDED MORE SUBS


DISTRIBUTION OF ALL SUB NEEDS

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION PATTERNS OF SUB NEEDS

 BOTH LONG-TERM AND SHORT-TERM SUB NEEDS ARE GEOGRAPHICALLY DISTRIBUTED FAIRLY CONSISTENTLY ACROSS THE DISTRICT.

- LONG-TERM SUBS NEEDS MAY HAVE SLIGHTLY HIGHER DISTRIBUTION IN THE CENTRAL AND SOUTHEASTERN PARTS OF TUSD
- SHORT-TERM SUBS NEEDS ARE DISPERSED THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT AND DO NOT SHOW A
 GEOGRAPHIC CONCENTRATION

SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM SUB FILL RATES

The greatest determinant for fill rates is the school type and not the geographic location. Alternative schools and middle schools have the greatest difficulty filling short-term sub positions.


2016-17 = 74%


SUBSTITUTE TEACHER AGE (AV. OVERALL = 55 YRS OLD) Histogram of Short-Term Substitutes by Age

SHORT-TERM TEACHER ABSENCE REASONS

Reasons for Needing a Short Term Sub	Percent
Sick Time	36%
Personal Days	26%
Other Administrative Absences (e.g. PD, trainings, school business, and other student activities, etc.)	26%
Other (e.g. Bereavement, FMLA/LOA, Jury duty, etc.)	12%

SUMMARY

- SUBS ARE DISPERSED GEOGRAPHICALLY ACROSS THE DISTRICT
- IN SY2017-18, THE AVERAGE SHORT-TERM SUB FILL RATE WAS 72%. BY SCHOOL TYPE:
 - ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS = 82%
 - K-8 SCHOOLS = 65%
 - MIDDLE SCHOOLS = 60%
 - HIGH SCHOOLS = 75%
 - ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLS = 31%
- DISPARITIES IN FILL RATES ARE MOST EVIDENT IN MIDDLE SCHOOLS AND ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLS
- SUB TEACHERS ARE PRIMARILY WHITE AND FEMALE AROUND 55 YEARS OLD
- MOST REASONS FOR NEEDING SUBS ARE OUTSIDE OF TUSD'S CONTROL WITH ONE EXCEPTION:
 PULLING TEACHERS OUT OF THE CLASSROOM FOR 'OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE'
