Superintendent's Draft Goals: 2016-17

- 1. Increase student enrollment. (The following metrics are offered due to the 40th day already having passed showing a slight 45 student Pre-K-12 increase and a slight 16 student K-12 decrease.)
 - a. Maintain 40th Day Enrollment through end of the school year with an increase from 40th day enrollment resulting in 100% of the goal met.
 - b. Anything less than the 40th day enrollment shall decrease the percentage in alignment with the percentage of students lost from the 40th day to end-of-year average enrollment.
- 2. Increase student academic achievement.
 - a. Increase AP student enrollment.
 - b. Increase minority AP student enrollment.
 - c. Increase and maintain UHS minority enrollment.
 - d. Increase GATE student enrollment.
 - e. Increase GATE minority student enrollment.
 - f. Improve upon overall AP score performance.
 - g. See a 10% increase from the first district benchmark to the second in math and reading.
 - h. Should AZMERIT arrive prior to the second Tuesday in June of 2017 (June 13, 2017), an increase of 10% in reading and math from last year's performance.
 - i. Increase the number of students enrolled in AVID.
 - j. Increase Pre-AP enrollment.
 - k. Increase the number of minority students enrolled in Pre-AP classes.
- 3. Increase the amount of district dollars associated with classroom instructional spending in line with the Arizona Auditor General's criteria.
 - a. Increase percentage in the classroom instruction category beyond 2015-16.
 - b. Increase percentage in the student support category beyond 2015-16.
 - c. Increase the percentage in the instructional support category beyond 2015-16.
 - d. Increase per-pupil expenditure beyond the 2015-16 school year.
- 4. Decrease the number of classrooms without certified teachers of record
 - a. HR will work this year to reduce the number of classrooms without certified teachers by 3-5%.
- 5. Decrease the amount of dollars directly associated with litigation opposing the implementation of the Unitary Status Plan (excludes any Board directed expenditures to pursue litigation).
- 6. Increase parental and community participation in the education of their children.
 - a. Increase opportunities for parents to obtain information over formats used in 2015-16.

- b. Provide structured opportunities for parents to engage with the district and provide feedback to the district.
- c. Increase opportunities for parents to acquire training or support from the district.
- d. Increase the use of Spanish-language content for parents.
- 7. Increase opportunities for prekindergarten education.
 - a. Increase the number of seats available for Pre-K students.
 - b. Increase Pre-K student enrollment.
 - c. Increase communication about Pre-K opportunities including DES, IELC, Community Schools, and Exceptional Education options.
- 8. Strengthen district curricula to reflect all students served by the Tucson Unified School District.
 - a. Ensure instructional and support staff have had multiple opportunities to learn how to use curricula 3.0.
 - b. Ensure curricula 4.0 provides for GATE learners.
 - c. Ensure curricula 4.0 provides for Emergent Bilingual Learners.
 - d. Ensure curricula 4.0 provides for Exceptional Education Learners.
 - e. Ensure multiple opportunities for training are scheduled for curricula 4.0.
 - f. Ensure an increase in training opportunities for CRC instructors beyond the 2015-16 school year.
- 9. Create campus cultures that promote safety and security.
 - a. Ensure multiple opportunities exist for staff to acquire training on the new district Code of Conduct prior to June 2017.
 - b. Should the Court not approve the new district Code of Conduct, ensure that multiple opportunities for training regarding the existing GSRR to take place prior to June 2017.
 - c. Decrease the number of level 4/5 discipline offenses from the 2015-16 school year.
 - d. Provide training opportunities for Restorative Practices.
 - e. Ensure each campus has a dedicated Restorative Support Team.
- 10. Create learning environments that provide students with simulated real-world experiences with tools used in today's workplace.
 - a. Provide structured opportunities to expand internships beyond the 2015-16 school year.
 - b. Increase the availability of technology for student use beyond the 2015-16 school year.
 - c. Increase student enrollment in JTED courses beyond the 2015-16 school year.
 - d. Work with the Technology Oversight Committee to devise goals to enhance technology use in instruction.

e. Establish industry advisory boards in no less than 4 Career and Technology stands to advise curricular design.
