Historical Timeline of Support Services

Native American Student Services Department

- Established in 1976 as a result of the Indian Education Act
- Originally named Native American Studies
- Name was changed in 2012
- Focus – direct and ancillary support
- Mentoring, tutoring, academic support

African American Student Services Department

- 1978 Stipulation formed Black Studies
- Named African American Studies in 1989
- African American Student Services in 2012
- Focus – direct and ancillary support
- Mentoring, tutoring, academic support

Dropout Prevention Department

- Established 1990
- Established through Arizona Revised Statute Chapter 399, Section 16
- Focus – Help students stay in school and graduate

Mexican American Student Services Department

- Originally Hispanic Studies in 1997
- Changed to Mexican American Studies in 1998
- Name changed to Mexican American Student Services in 2012
- Focus – direct and ancillary support
- Mentoring, tutoring, academic support

Asian Pacific American Student Services

- Pan Asian Studies Department was established in 1998
- Name changed to Asian Pacific American Studies in 2011
- Became Asian Pacific American Student Services in 2012
- Focus – direct and ancillary support
- Mentoring, tutoring, classroom support

Life Skills

Alternative to Suspension Program

- Established 2005
- Focus – meet needs of students
 - Suspended from home school on long-term suspensions
 - Intervention alternative education setting
 - Dropout prevention
 - Academic instruction

Refugee Student Services

- Opened the Refugee Center in 2005
- Moved to Family & Community Outreach in 2010
- Part of Department of Student Equity and Intervention in 2012
- Focus –Acclimate students and families to school and community
- Mentoring, tutoring, classroom support

Family & Community Outreach

- March 2010
- Created to consolidate resources for Homeless, Refugee, Delinquent & Neglected Youth
- Primary focus – identification of homeless and delinquent students
- Coordination, advocacy, academic support

CORE PLUS

Academic Intervention Program

- Established 2011
- Focus – to provide academic intervention to low performing 6th grade students.



System of Supports

Scenario

Single Parent with 5 Children

- Attendance concerns
- Two students on probation
- Oldest child is a runaway
- Substandard housing
- Discipline issues

System of Supports

- Home visits
- Outreach to community resources
- Required a referral to CPS
- Partnered with high school to provide support
- Provide on-going mentoring
- Exceptional Education referral evaluation process
- Provided behavior support
- Homeless services provided
- Working with Juvenile Justice
