4Tucson

- 4Tucson organizes churches throughout Tucson to help meet the needs of TUSD students and families and offer support to schools, neighborhoods and teachers.
 - Serve our Schools (SOS) on July 26, 27 and August 2, 2014: An estimated 100 churches mobilized over 800 volunteers to impact at least 80 schools spanning 7 school districts.
 - Pantano Church 400 back packs with supplies to Van Buskirk Elementary School, painted the stage wall, and served breakfast to the staff.
 - Christ Community Church-Santa Rita 150-200 Backpacks and prayer walk for the school, painted hallways and hosted a barbecue.
 - Vineyard Christian Fellowship- 150 volunteers served Mansfeld Middle Magnet School, Roskruge Bilingual Middle Magnet School, and Davis Bilingual Elementary Magnet School.
 - The Well built 6 shelving units at Hollinger K-8 School, volunteers cleaned and organized 2 large storage rooms with supplies. Collected approximately 50 children's books for Maldonado Elementary School's library.

City of Tucson - Office of the Mayor

- The Mayor's office, in concert with the United Way, also partnered with TUSD during the month of September to focus on student attendance.
- Nationally, September was Attendance Awareness Month; therefore, a local attendance recognition initiative was conceptualized and implemented which resulted in first, second and third place winners at each school level (i.e., elementary, K-8, middle and high school).
- Steps to Success 2.0 January 2015.

Boys and Girls Clubs of Tucson

- Provide academic assistance to students who attend the Boys and Girls Clubs after school.
- Currently working on a program that will provide transportation from school to clubhouses for 100 students.

Higher Ground

- TUSD is working with Higher Ground to assist with services in the areas of counseling, credit recovery, college prep and mentoring.
- They serve approximately 130 students in the program, 95-98% of whom are TUSD students.

United Way

- The United Way of Tucson and Southern Arizona have also partnered to establish a re-engagement center, which will be housed at the Wakefield Family Engagement Center.
- Collaborative effort will provide another avenue for former students to take advantage of returning to a school setting and preparing themselves for the world of work and/or college.
