

Current Situation


- Nationwide rural and urban areas face the same challenges to high performing education services as TUSD.
 - Declining student enrollment / Reduced funding.
- Yet, the 21st century global economy demands even higher levels of performance from schools, students and their educators.

State and National Models

- School Districts, comparable in size to TUSD, such as Mesa Unified School District and Boston Public Schools, began a conversation with their community, a conversation about higher student achievement in the face of diminishing resources.









Hollinger to Mission View, Ochoa, Van Buskirk








Consolidation Considerations

- Neighborhood impacts
- Impact on students
- Access (parent & student)
- Less small schools/choice

Mitigation

- Communicate & listen
- Involve those affected
- Use/secure closed sites
- "Match" programs






